

plan:g ends ILEP Membership Why? And what's next?

- plan:g will review the decision to leave ILEP within three years
- We note that as of 2018 with ILEP, ILA, IDEA and the zero leprosy initiative we got several umbrella organizations that are concerned with overcoming leprosy.
 plan:g agrees that a strong civil society voice is needed when it comes to talking to WHO, or the pharmaceutical industry. Plan:g regards IDEA as the voice of people affected as especially important. However, coordination would mean to unite most civil society players under one umbrella – not opening new ones.
- plan:g believes that umbrella organisations are most efficient and cost effective if they limit communication work to concrete, hands- on lobbying objectives.
- plan:g is a member of Health Action International (HAI) and therefore quite reluctant when it comes to engaging with the pharmaceutical industry.
- plan:g feels uncomfortable with chemo-prophylaxis for leprosy, and with vaccine development. Instead, plan:g favors PHC strengthening and full integration of vertical NTD programs.
- Although we appreciate the contribution of the Novartis Foundation in overcoming leprosy, plan:g does not intend to serve as a fig leaf covering some of Novartis' rather problematic activities in partner countries of development cooperation.
- plan:g feels strong about the CONCORD/Dochas code of conduct on images and messages.
- plan:g will continuously provide change-management support for institutions
 working to overcome leprosy and other neglected tropical diseases. We are
 convinced that we need new procedures today, training of additional leprosy
 technicians became part of the problem, not part of the solution.
- plan:g will continuously seek to advance partnership with like- or similar-minded ILEP member organizations.
- Also, and on the small scale as of today, plan:g will continuously fund Leprosy
 Research Initiative (LRI) projects (with the notable exception of chemo-prophylaxis
 and vaccine development), and others
- plan:g shall continuously support innovations such as funding smartphone applications such as the "RehApp"-project (if independent evaluation is included).
